He has been actively involved in the completion of various required documents including School building permit, Occupancy, building related papers, SWOT Analysis, Internal and External Analysis Report, Personnel and Manpower Requirement Report, Stakeholders' and Immersion Partners Engagement, Program/Course, Initial School Improvement Plan, Local Government Clearances among others.

2. Produced NC II Passers in Electrical Installation & Maintenance

He has conducted thorough training, review and institutional assessment practice to enhance students' competencies on EIM both for JHS & SHS that is necessary to pass the NC II assessment given by the TESDA the fact that the school has very limited equipment and facilities.

3. Conceptualized Teaching Strategies for TLE

He has created a contextualized approach in the delivery of lesson for TVL subjects. Some of the teaching techniques include GROUPIE Learning Approach and REACT Strategy. Both were crafted into an action research and presented in various forums.

4. Written at least seven (7) Action Research in the areas of Technology Education

He has completed two (2) developmental researches, three (3) quasi-experimental researches and two (2) social science researches.

5. Presented and winner of researches in various research forum

Successfully presented the researches he conducted in different research gatherings including the CDREAM, PCBER, ICBER, and the CBER-SEA

6. BERF Grantee

He was a Basic Education Research Fund (2nd Tranche) completer. He was one among the few to qualify for this funded research activity of the regional office.

regular functions/mandated or the product of his/her initiative. If parts of the nominee's regular duties or mandated, justify why the accomplishments are considered exemplary or extraordinary.

1. Initiated School Research Training (DNNHS) for all teachers. Facilitated the conduct of Action Research writing in school. This research training has yield roughly 10 action researches and almost 15 teacher-researchers fully presented at CDREAM 2017. It was the very first time that the school has produced a volume action research for a given school year. The nominee, Mr. Fronton I. Oronan, was then a Research Focal of DJPRSHS and DNNHS simultaneously. Similarly, the DJPRSHS has presented 4 action research out of 8 teaching personnel during the school year 2017 – 2018.
2. The Accomplishment and the Approval of Certificate of Establishment of Dr. Jose P. Rizal Senior High School by the DepEd Regional Office as a recognized Stand-Alone Senior High School has been an important milestone of the school. The nominee Mr. Fronton I. Oronan was the only personnel who have complied the numerous and tough documentary requirements needed for the Application for the Establishment of Stand-alone senior High school. He has complied the long list of required documents within just 2 weeks after the initial documents has not succeeded at the regional office. The approval of the Certificate of establishment of DJPRSHS entitled the school to be cognized as Stand-Alone Senior High School, School Identification number was officially given, Official Name of the School was created (Necessary for legal / financial documents), provision for MOOE budgeting and recognition of Immersion Partners.
3. He has successfully incorporated in the Application for Program offerings for the Stands: HUMSS and Technical Drafting of TVL track. The inclusion of this 2 curricular strands has solved the high influx of student enrollees who are initially included in other strands while the school was not yet recognized by the regional Office to offer this 2 programs.
4. Served as School Coordinator of Dr. Jose P. Rizal Senior High School. Managed and supervised instructional and administrative operation of the school. Due to double accountability of School principal Mr. Melvin Layugan (for DNNHS and DJPRSHS), Mr. Oronan has been the school administrator to implement both curriculum and school operations related matter simultaneously being a fully loaded Teacher / Adviser and multiple coordinatorship including TVL Coordinator, Research focal, DRRM Coordinator, Master Teacher functions and all other tasks.
